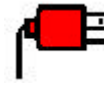

Google (www.google.com) is a new search engine that claims to use "a complicated mathematical analysis, calculated on more than a billion hyperlinks on the web, to return high-quality search results so you don't have to sift through junk.

This analysis allows Google to estimate the quality, or importance, of every web page it returns. The importance of a web page is entirely independent of any query. A page like has high importance if other pages with high importance point to it and lots of other pages with high importance point to page.

This definition seems circular, and it is. Nonetheless, it yields a well-defined notion of importance that makes finding high quality sites easy."
